PROJECT 1: WARM UP! FRAMING / CUTTING

10% of final grade (5% for shots, 5% for edits) Work individually. Assets on portable media, ready for exchange no later than **Monday, April 10 (Week 2)**.

Part 1:

Shoot the following (clean shots, proper white balance, exposure, and focus, 1080 24p).

1) A subject of your choosing in a space of your choosing:

- _____ 2 different wide angles
- _____2 different medium shots
- _____2 different close ups
- _____2 different details of the space without the subject

2) ____1 long(ish) take of a different space that involves camera motion (pan, tilt, dolly, truck, hand-held, etc.) Note that the motion is not random, you should choose a location and subject that necessitates the camera motion.

3) The following:

- _____1 shot that suggests tension / fear / apprehension
- _____1 shot that suggests happiness / elation / peace
- _____1 shot that suggests boredom / ambivalence

For the 1st part (subject in space), it will probably be helpful to imagine a loose/impressionistic story, and/or a cinematic "look" that you are interested in exploring. You are free to incorporate this idea into the subsequent shots, however they need to stand alone (so 12 shots total). The project is less about complex, developed narratives and more about re-familiarizing yourself with the shooting / framing process.

Part 2:

Editing: building something out of nothing.

Swap your assets with a partner. Edit them into something cohesive. Shoot additional scenes and/ or add assets if you feel it would round out the narrative/sequence that is emerging. Aprox. 2 minutes, but there is no time minimum for this exercise.
